MaineGeneral is committed to your care. We are honored to receive top quality and patient satisfaction awards this year, including the Newsweek World's Best Hospitals awards list 2022, the Leapfrog A Safety Grade and two Women's Choice Awards.

These awards and recognition are a testament to the hard work of our staff and our commitment to high-quality, patient-centered care. >

The detailed methodology for the Newsweek distinctions are based on patient experience, hospital recommendation from peers, patient experience and data on patient safety, hygiene measures and quality of treatment.





MaineGeneral Medical Center earned an "A" on the Spring 2022 Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade. Developed under the guidance of an expert panel, the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade uses 30 measures of publicly-available hospital safety data to assign letter grades to more than 2,600 hospitals.



MaineGeneral has earned the Women's Choice Best Hospitals for Orthopaedics and Best Mammogram Imaging Centers. The evidence-based designation identifies hospitals that meet high standards regarding a woman's preference for care.





State-of-the-Art Care, Close to Home

Dr. Dan Filitis recently became one of the first Mohs surgeons in the country to be board-certified in Micrographic Dermatologic Surgery by the American Board of Dermatology. Dr. Filitis practices at MaineGeneral/MDFMR Dermatology in Augusta. "Until just recently, there was never such a thing as a board-certified Mohs surgeon, so it's very exciting to have that recognition," he said. "With regard to patient care, it establishes a standard of care nationally and creates an expectation in patient experience that I don't think was there before." 

During the last two years we rallied together, while apart, to raise more than \$300,000 in support of local cancer care. Our supporters' dollars have:

- Purchased a new biobank freezer, allowing for increased sample storage which broadens our ability to participate in clinical research trials and contribute to cancer research;
- Purchased equipment to increase accuracy as well as patient comfort during breast, head and neck imaging exams and radiation treatments;
- Replaced chemistry analyzers in the lab, speeding up processing times and decreasing patient wait times;
- Purchased pedometers for the Cancer Recovery program; and
- Supported many of the HACCC's other operating needs.




Gratitude Paid FOLLACION TO THE PAID TO T

Imagine you need surgery. What considerations would you take into account when choosing a surgeon? For Steve LaVerdiere, it was expertise and an at-home recovery. In Fall 2020, Steve fell from his treadmill, fracturing three vertebrae. He and his wife Peggy knew the required surgery would be complicated – but with COVID-19, they wanted to avoid an inpatient stay at all costs. They did research near and far and scheduled a consult with Dr. Stephen Clark at MaineGeneral Orthopaedics. Dr. Clark took all of their considerations into account, tasking Peggy with caretaking and a home care follow-up before he would consider a post-surgical home recovery. In November 2020, Dr. Clark completed Steve's surgery at the Thayer Center for Health sending him home the same day to recover.

Steve and Peggy were – and remain – so grateful for Dr. Clark's care and his consideration of their wishes.


Dr. Clark is a top-notch, high-caliber surgeon. We feel so fortunate to have his services available right here in Central Maine.

Philanthropy Spotlight: Donor-Advised Funds

You might not think of yourself as a philanthropist but, as someone with a generous heart, we know you want to give as much as you are able to the causes and organizations you care about. The Office of Philanthropy stays current with giving options that may appeal to donors who want to maximize their charitable impact while taking taxes into account. We aim to bring awareness to the many ways you could have more available to give, when you want to give, including donor-advised funds.



What is a Donor-Advised Fund?

A donor-advised fund (DAF) is much like a charitable savings account, where your contributions to the DAF are set aside for grantmaking to MaineGeneral and other qualified charities, as advised by you, the original donor(s). The DAF is held by a financial or community institution's charitable arm (such as Fidelity Charitable, Schwab Charitable, the Maine Community Foundation, Vanguard Charitable, et al.), that distributes your donation as advised.

How a DAF Works

At first glance, giving through a DAF could seem a bit complicated, but the process is straightforward:

- A donor sets up a DAF at a qualified institution and contributes (donates) a chunk of funding to get started. Donors receive a tax deduction when they make an eligible donation into a DAF, and they can keep contributing to the fund over the years.
- Once a donation goes into a DAF, the donor becomes a donor-advisor for the DAF. This means they can recommend grants out of the fund balance to nonprofits the donor-advisor cares about. Most DAFs have minimum grant amounts (e.g., \$100).
- The recipient organization receives the DAF's check and thanks the donor-advisor for recommending the grant, if the donor-advisor is known. The nonprofit will not issue a tax receipt, as any deductions were already received by the donoradvisor when contributing into the DAF.

What Are Potential Benefits of a DAF??

- Donor-advised funds may be a good giving vehicle for you if you might otherwise incur estate taxes or capital gains taxes on appreciated assets.
- The DAF-holding institution controls the contributed assets, and they are responsible to conduct due diligence reviews prior to making a grant, which frees you from that burden.
- While we would love to personally thank you for furthering our mission through a grant, giving through a DAF can allow you to remain completely anonymous and unknown when recommending a grant to MaineGeneral, if desired.
- Setting up a DAF also allows you to plan a lasting legacy by naming MaineGeneral as a designated beneficiary for a percentage or the entirety of the fund, ensuring your contributions continue to serve your philanthropic objectives beyond your lifetime.


Annual aign 2021-22


